### BUDGET HEARING

### BUDGET HEARING: 2019 Operating Budget:

-Elected officials, Department Heads and supported agencies were asked to submit preliminary budget requests for the 2019 Operating Year. After reviewing the requests, the Commission then overviewed the proposed budget and made revisions. The proposed 2019 Operating Budget is now presented to the L on County Commission to receive public comment.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, presented the 2019 Proposed Budget. Hathcock said it represents an organizational blueprint to maintain delivery of quality public services at an affordable cost to the taxpayer while maintaining a near constant mill levy.

### C. ADOPTION OF THE 2019 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS LISTING:

-To assure that offices are operating with appropriate personnel, the 2019 Authorized Positions listing is presented for adoption. The listing includes all County positions, including Central Kansas Community Corrections and 20th Judicial District Juvenile Services, since both fall under the umbrella of County operations.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said there have been no changes since the listing was last approved. Hathcock said there are 190 full-time, 9 part-time, 38 on-call and 8 temporary employees.

### D. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN:

Trough the budgeting process, Barton County plans for cash transfers, as savings, to the Capital provement Plan. This plan, as revised each year, allows for the projected maintenance and remodeling of County buildings and major modifications to roads and bridges.

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Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said department heads and elected officials work together to create the 5-year plan.

Commissioner Schartz said the 5-year plans help in not having to raise money other ways.

Commissioner Straub said the plan keeps us financially sound and said that way we don't have to raise taxes on people unnecessarily.

Commissioner Schartz said the County is in a sound financial position with the team of Phil, Donna, Matt and the commissioners.

Commissioner Straub moved to adopt the 2019 Capital Improvement Plan. Commissioner Straub seconded the motion. All voted ave. Motion passed.

### E. EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT PLAN:

-Through the budgeting process, Barton County plans for cash transfers, as savings, to the Equipment Replacement Plan. The plan is developed and revised each year for the purpose of ensuring that equipment costs is kept at a manageable level.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said this plan covers mostly copiers, vehicles and heavy equipment.

Commissioner Schremmer moved to adopt the 2019 Equipment Replacement Plan. Commissioner Straub seconded the motion. oted ave. Motion passed.

F. SOUTHWEST DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES, INC: Agreement for Services:

-Southwest Developmental Services, Inc. (SDSI) is the Community Developmental Disability Organization (CDDO) for the County. Under the 2019 service agreement, SDSI will provide all services required by Kansas statutes for a CDDO for a total of \$70,000.00.

Phil Hathcock, County Administrator, said in 2004, Barton County designated SDSI as the Developmental Disability Organization for the County, and asked for approval of the agreement.

Commissioner Schremmer said SDSI has done a tremendous job over the years.

Commissioner Schremmer moved to approve the SDSI Agreement for Services for 2019 at \$70,000.00. Commissioner Straub seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

#### RESOLUTION 2018-14

- A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE PROPERTY TAXATION POLICY OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BARTON COUNTY, KANSAS, WITH RESPECT TO FINANCING THE 2018 ANNUAL BUDGET FOR BARTON COUNTY
- WHEREAS, K.S.A. 79-2925b provides that a Resolution be adopted if property taxes levied to finance the 2018 Barton County Budget exceed the amount levied to finance the 2018 Barton County Budget, except with regard to revenue produced and attributable to the taxation of 1) new improvements to real property; 2) increased personal property valuation, other than increased valuation of oil and gas leaseholds and mobile homes; and 3) property which has changed in use during the past year; or with regard to revenue produced for the purpose of repaying the principal of and interest upon bonded indebtedness, temporary notes or no-fund warrants; and
- WHEREAS, budgeting, taxing and service level decisions for all County services are the responsibility of the Board of County Commissioners; and
- WHEREAS, Barton County provides these essential services to protect the health, safety and well being of its citizens; and
- WHEREAS, the cost of the provision of these services continues to increase; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Kansas State Legislature failed to fulfill its obligation in regard to the statutory funding of demand transfers and, by significantly limiting State revenue sharing payments to Counties, has contributed to higher County property tax levies to finance the 2019 Barton County Budget.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Barton County, Kansas, that the public is hereby notified of the possibility of increased property taxes to finance the 2019 Barton County Budget due to the above mentioned constraints; and
- **FURTHER,** that on July 20, 2018, the Budget Summary was published in the official County newspaper, notifying the public of the property tax rate and Budget Hearing; and
- **FURTHER**, that the Board of County Commissioners conducted the aforesaid Budget Hearing on July 30, 2018, at 9:00 a.m., and heard public comments and addressed questions on the proposed budget; and

**FURTHER**, that the public comments were taken into consideration prior to the adoption of the 2018 Operating Budget.

FURTHER, that this Resolution shall be published in the Great Bend Tribune.
