Safe Haven Sites for Infants----A mother can leave her newborn baby, up to 45 days old, with an employee at any medical facility, fire department, city, or county health department in Kansas. In Kansas, no one ever has to abandon a child again.

Newborns up to 45 days old can now be safely given up by mothers to employees at Health Departments, Hospitals, Medical Facilities, or Fire Departments in Kansas with no consequences or abandonment charges. This new program ensures the safety and health of newborns.

The agency has seventeen masters level clinicians licensed to provide clinical services such as individual therapy, marital/couples therapy, family therapy, and group therapy for sexual abuse, anger evaluations, psychological evaluations, and parenting evaluations.

Regular therapy services are initiated by an intake evaluation. Psychological evaluations require a court order or physician's referral. Parenting evaluations require a court order.

Fees for family therapy and group therapy for sexual abuse evaluations are due on the day of the evaluation. All fees for services are based on a sliding fee scale according to income and family size. However, evaluations are the one exception and those fees are a flat rate.

The Children's Based Services (CBS) program provides support to children who experience severe emotional disturbance and their families. Within the CBS program, available services

include case management, parent support, attendant care and psychosocial groups. The program operates from a strengths-based approach and utilizes “wraparound” in the treatment planning process. We combine professional support with community resources to meet the needs of the child and family.

Services are accessed through a referral made by the therapist. All services must meet medical necessity guidelines and be indicated in the child’s treatment plan.

Children who are at risk of psychiatric hospitalization and meet additional criteria may be eligible for the Home and Community Based Services waiver. This program offers additional services to assist in keeping kids in their home and in their community.

Appointments to juvenile court cases are made by a juvenile judge. A child must be adjudicated as a "child in need of care" (CINC) by the court. The judge issues an order to assign a volunteer for the child.

Training is provided in the fall to those persons interested in becoming a CASA volunteer. We have a 30 hour independent study course. A volunteer must have background checks and be 21 years old or more.

- **Kingdom Closet** provides clothing, linens and household items for \$1.00 a bag. Open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10-1p.m.
- **Hungry Heart Soup Kitchen** has a time of fellowship along with coffee and a snack from 10-11:30 and then serves a free hot lunch meal from 11:45-12:30 Monday through Friday.
- **DCYL (DC Youth Living)** is a residential program for girls 18-21 who have aged out of the foster care system. Staff & volunteers help with continuation and furthering their education as well as independent living skills, spiritual growth and their identity in Christ.
- **The Anchor** is an outreach to the community; providing a mailbox program for those in the community who do not have a permanent address due to homelessness. This address can be used to apply for jobs in the community, getting an ID, or receiving government assistance. Also, multiple groups are offered to the community.
- **9-month Residential Discipleship program** is a Christian-based residential program that helps men and women to overcome life-controlling issues that include but are not limited to substance abuse, anger, depression and the emotional residue left by mental, physical and sexual abuse through the use of a proven faith based curriculum.
- **Lasting Life Ministries Financial Aid program** is for individuals who have received a shut off notice or eviction notice. We do require you go to seek assistance at Emergency Aid first. We accept applications on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00am – 1:00pm.

(We do not pay deposits). Individuals applying for assistance must be experiencing an unexpected crisis situation in their household, this includes or related to medical, employment, sudden disruption of family, death, or other type of crisis. 3 types of applications.

1. Emergency application: utilities with shut off notice in applicant's name. Rent with a 30 day or less notice of eviction or vacate premises for nonpayment. Gas vouchers for residents starting or currently employed.
2. Transient: local or out of state (emergency to be determined at time of application) may include lodging and/or gas voucher with identification.
3. Local homeless application: after hours 1 overnight stay with lodging voucher through Barton County Sheriff Department. Identification required. Gas voucher for start or current employment.

Amount awarded is limited and usually not sufficient to cover the full amount requested for rent, utilities, etc.. EA will assist to identify or suggest other resources available in our area. EA will require various documentation to determine identity, crisis and need in order to use funds in the

Safe Haven Sites for Infants

Newborns up to 45 days old can now be safely given up by mothers to employees at **Health Departments, Hospitals, Medical Facilities or Fire Departments in Kansas (with employees present)** with no consequences or abandonment charges. This new program ensures the safety and health of newborns. In Kansas, no one ever has to abandon a child again.

How does it work?

A distressed parent who is unable or unwilling to care for their infant can give up custody of their baby, no questions asked. They must simply bring the infant to a safe haven location and make sure they locate a person to give the child. As long as the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no name or other information is required. The specific locations and maximum age of the child varies from state to state. You can find the details of for your location by using our [Safehaven Finder](#). It's safe. It's anonymous. You do not need to tell anyone.

What's the difference between Safe Haven and Adoption?

To place your infant for adoption, you must make an adoption plan and enter into a legal contract where you forfeit your right to custody of your child. Safe Haven arrangements do not require paperwork or contracts. The process is anonymous, so long as your baby is unharmed.

Baby Safe Haven laws allow you to give your baby to a responsible adult at a designated location, and walk away, no questions asked. If you do not return to reclaim your baby, your parental rights will be terminated in a few months, and the child will be adopted by a family waiting for a child.

Can only a parent bring in the baby?

No. The parent may choose to have someone else bring in the infant. It can be a family member, a friend, a priest or minister, a social worker—practically any responsible adult.

Can you help a parent decide where to bring the baby?

Yes. The parent can call the Safe Haven Hotline **1-888-510-BABY** to receive counseling and get details on the address and directions to the closest safe haven in your state.

Does a parent have to call before bringing in the baby?

No. A parent can walk in anytime, provided that there are staff present to receive the child at the safe haven location.

Does a parent have to tell anything to the people taking the baby?

No. Nothing is required. However, safe haven staff will record any information that a parent is willing to share, such as the child's health, race, date of birth, place of birth or the medical history of the parents. This could be very useful in caring for the child.

What happens to the baby?

The child will be examined and given medical treatment, if needed. The Social Services Administration will then take custody through Child Protective Services and place the child with an appropriate caregiver.

Does my state have a Baby Safe Haven law?

Yes. Every state in the United States has a Baby Safe Haven provision. The [law details](#) vary from state to state, so it's important you learn about your state's requirements.

What is a Baby Safe Haven Law?

Infant Abandonment laws or "Baby Safe Haven" laws exist to enable a person to relinquish an unwanted infant anonymously. If a mother cannot care for her child, she can bring that baby into a Safe Haven location and leave the baby with a responsible adult, no questions asked. As long as the baby has not been abused, the person may do so without fear of arrest or prosecution.

Why are states offering Safe Haven Laws?

The purpose of Safe Haven is to protect unwanted babies from being hurt or killed because they were abandoned. You may have heard tragic stories of babies left in dumpsters or public toilets. The parents who committed these acts may have been under severe emotional distress. The mothers may have hidden their pregnancies, fearful of what would happen if their families found out. Because they were afraid and had nowhere to turn for help, they abandoned their babies.

Abandoning a baby puts the child in extreme danger. Too often, it results in the child's death. It is also illegal, with severe consequences. But with Safe Haven, this tragedy doesn't ever have to happen again.

What if I change my mind?

It's rare that a mother changes her mind. But, if you do, you will have a few days to come back and speak with the authorities about what arrangements can be made for the baby.

I'm in a custody battle. How do I know my spouse won't use the Safe Haven law to take away my child?

Safe Haven laws and locations are only for infants. If your child isn't an infant, there's no way the Safe Haven law can be used. If your child is an infant, rest assured that when a baby comes into the Safe Haven program, authorities across the US are notified and a thorough check is done to make sure no one is looking for the baby.
