I. OPENING BUSINESS:

Commissioner Schartz called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M.

Commissioner Krier moved to approve the agenda.

Commissioner Schremmer seconded the motion.

Commissioner Schremmer moved to approve the minutes of the June 1, 2009 Regular Meeting.

III. OLD BUSINESS:

A. INVENTORY OF COUNTY PROPERTY: Sheriff's Office:

-Per KSA 19-2687, each county officer and head of a department shall make an inventory of the personal property owned by the County and located in such office or department. The inventory, which shall be taken during the month of December of each year, shall be filed with the County Clerk on or before December 31 of each year. The inventory shall not include books, records, files, stationery, writing materials and blank legal papers. The information will be presented to the Commission during February of each year. The County's inventory, less a listing from the Sheriff's Office, was approved on February 23, 2009. Since that time, an inventory listing was prepared for the department by Adams, Brown, Beran and Ball.

Sheriff Greg Armstrong provided details. We have a complete inventory listing prepared by Adams, Brown, Beran and Ball. However, Armstrong reported there were some items like a laptop computer and flat screens they could not locate, that people knew were there, but now could not be found and the KBI was looking into this. Also, they recovered another weapon and shoulder holster we didn't know existed. They pulled receipts, and compared receipts for items purchased against what was on the inventory list and if was not there, then they knew it was missing.

IV. NEW BUSINESS:

A. JUVENILE SERVICES: Grant Application -- Teen Court:

-Generally, the Teen Court program provides an alternative response for the juvenile justice system for first-time, misdemeanor juvenile offenders, in which teens determine the appropriate sanctions for the offender. Teen Court allows youth in middle and high school after admitting guilt to have a "sentencing hearing" with students acting as jurors. An adult judge presides and a jury of peers determines the sentence.

Laurie White, Juvenile Services Director, reviewed the current grant request.

Commissioner Krier moved to authorize the submission of a Title V Grant to Don Chronister, Juvenile Justice Specialist, Juvenile Justice Authority, Topeka by June 12, 2009 at 4:30 pm. Match funding to be provided through United Way funds, the General Fund and a combination of various Diversion Funds and in-kind services.

Commissioner Schremmer seconded the motion.

All voted aye. Motion passed.

B. BARTON COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION: Board Appointments:

-For some time, the County has actively sought applicants for the Barton County Planning Commission. The focus of the Planning Commission is to plan for the proper growth and development of Barton County through the enactment of planning and zoning laws for the protection of the public health, safety and welfare. The nine-member board has uncompensated three-year positions. Although all applicants must reside in Barton County, the majority of members must be from the unincorporated area. Currently, one position, expiring in 2012, is open.

Judy Goreham, Environmental Manager, detailed the application process.



